If you miss out on Pre-Registration, don't worry you will still be welcome to join us at Goosestock. Onsite registration will be available all weekend long during the event.

Back when Woodsman's Village lived in big canvas tents in the Great Woods, the end-of-year cleanup involved a lot of heavy lifting. After the tents and bunks were taken down and carried away there were three heavy wooden platforms to secure. These had to be tipped up and leaned against a tree for the winter. Goose, Russ Ellsworth, and I lined up along one side, lifted a platform up overhead in one motion, and then slowly walked forward to lean it against a tree. With effort, the second platform was lifted. The third and heaviest was still waiting.

From a safe distance Goose said, "Don't move". This is probably the best two words of advice I have ever received. The alternative would have been to drop the platform down onto myself breaking some number of bones while at the same time squishing four skunks. The resulting pain, blood, and dead skunk smell that might still be with me today.

I did not move. The mother skunk and her three kits walked slowly past me without incident, proving that good timing is a key part of good advice.
